Sharp rise in foodbank referrals



Harlow Foodbank has seen a significant rise in referrals since August 2017, mainly due to the introduction of Universal Credits in Harlow in July 2017.

By the end of the financial year in March 2018 it had provided emergency food in Harlow and the surrounding area to 4,102 people, namely 2,448 adults and 1,654 children. This is an increase of 1,044 people (34%) compared to the same period in the previous year.

The worrying feature of these figures is that over half (560) of these referrals were for children from low-income families.

To date Harlow Foodbank has fed 24,520 people (15,920 adults and 8,600 children) with emergency food since it opened in April 2009 and now needs 5.2 tonnes of donated food each month to meet the current demand, so please help us by gifts of food or by making a financial donation.

LATEST STATS

24,520 people (15,920 adults and 8,600 children) received emergency food in Harlow and the surrounding area between April 2009 and March 2018

- 342 people on average are fed by Foodbank each month
- 154 Foodbank vouchers have been issued by our front-line partners each month
- 5.2 tonnes of non-perishable food are required each month to feed local people in crisis
 - 9 primary/academy schools are receiving support from the Foodbank for their breakfast club
 - 4 supermarkets (Tesco, ASDA, Sainsbury's and Waitrose) are working with the Foodbank by encouraging customer food donations
- 7.8 tonnes of harvest donations were received from churches and schools in November & December
